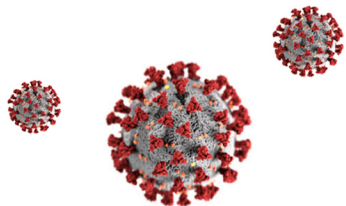


Pet Safety During the Covid-19 Pandemic

Put a plan in place if you become ill and need to be hospitalized, in addition to preparations typically recommended for any natural disaster threat.

1. Ensure that you have necessary pet items on hand ahead of time:
2. Have a month-long supply of pet food and prescription or non-prescription medications.
3. Ensure all medications are documented with dosages and administering directions.
4. Make sure your pet(s) wear collars and tags with up-to-date contact information and other identification.
5. Microchip your pet(s) – this is one of the best ways to ensure that you and your pet are reunited if you are separated.
6. Have crates, food and extra supplies on hand for quick movement of pets.
7. Keep all animal vaccines up to date in the event boarding becomes necessary.
8. Identify a family member or a friend who can care for pets if you are hospitalized.
